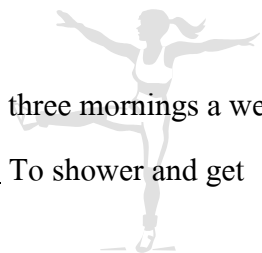

Two is company, (but) three's a crowd.

Two is company, three is none.

If a third person is present, it prevents the other two from enjoying each other's company as much as they would if the third person were not present. This proverb is used especially when two of the people have a romantic relationship with each other.

A modern, more informal version of this proverb is : two's company, three's a crowd.



♪ **comfortable** (adj.) =

feeling physically relaxed, without any pain or other unpleasant feelings

♪ **all right** :

used for checking that someone understands or agrees

♪ **nerve** (N) =

a rude attitude, usually shown by behaving that makes other people angry

♪ **be off** (informal) =

leave, go away, especially in a hurry :

He glanced at his watch. “And by the way, I must be off.”

♪ **upset** (adj.) =

very sad, worried, or angry about sth.

♪ **mean** (adj.) =

not willing to give or use sth. freely, stingy

♪ **Sarah is away in Scotland** =

Sarah has gone to Scotland.

♪ **give someone a ring** =

to telephone someone

♪ **drop someone a line** =

to send a short informal letter

♪ **once in a while** =

sometimes

♪ **drop by** =

to make a short visit to someone

♪ **ride (N)** =

a journey on a horse or other animals, on a bicycle or motorcycle, or in a vehicle

♪ **vehicle (N)** =

a machine that you travel in or on, especially one with engine that travels on roads.

♪ **mean (V)** =

to intend to do sth., often sth. bad or wrong

♪ **run into** =

meet s.o. when you did not expect to

♪ **recognize** =

to know (s.o. or sth.) because you have seen, heard or experienced them or it before : I hadn't seen her for 20 years, but I recognized her immediately.

♪ **remember (V) =**

to be able to bring back (a piece of information) into your mind, or to keep  
(a piece of information)

in your memory :

“Where did you park the car?”

“I can’t remember.”

♪ **In other words =**

Express the same meaning but in another way, for example by using different  
words :

You think he should make a positive career move outside this organization .....  
in other words you think he should leave.

♪ It took all day for us to drive home.

♪ It took us all day to drive home.

♪ I’ve spent many years building up my collection.

♪ I spent an hour at the station waiting for the train.

♪ **take a chance/ take chances =**

to do something even though it involves a risk.
