J upset (adj.) =

very sad, worried, or angry about sth.

☐ mean (adj.) =

not willing to give or use sth. freely, stingy

∫ give someone a ring =

to telephone someone



drop someone a line =

to send a short informal letter

once in a while =

sometimes

drop by =

to make a short visit to someone

∫ ride (N) =

a journey on a horse or other animals, on a bicycle or motorcycle, or in a vehicle

✓ vehicle (N) =

a machine that you travel in or on, especially one with engine that travels on roads.

∫ mean (V) =

to intend to do sth., often sth. bad or wrong

≠ run into =

meet s.o. when you did not expect to

recognize =

to know (s.o. or sth.) because you have seen, heard or experienced them or it

before: I hadn't seen her for 20 years, but I recognized her immediately.



remember (V) =

to be able to bring back (a piece of information) into your mind, or to keep (a piece of information)

in your memory:

"Where did you park the car?"

"I can't remember."

I In other words =

Express the same meaning but in another way, for example by using different words:

You think he should make a positive career move outside this organization in other words you think he should leave.

- It took all day for us to drive home.
- **I** It took us all day to drive home.
- I've spent many years building up my collection.
- **♬** I spent an hour at the station waiting for the train.

∫ take a chance/ take chances =

to do something even though it involves a risk.
